 Congressional action will be in the form of a direction included in the pending river and harbor bill for an examination. The examination can, however, be provided for by resolution of the Committee on Commerce of the Senate or the Committee on Rivers and Harbors of the House of Representatives, as provided for in section 3 (bottom page 50) of the river and harbor act of March 2, 1907.
 The papers and photographs left by you at this office have been retained for use in connection with any further examination which may be directed.
