**IF YOU THINK YOU'RE IN LOVE**

THEN WEAR PINK. IF YOU'RE SAD, NOT FEELING GAY, THAT'S THE TIME TO DRESS IN GRAY.

And if You Want to Concentrate, Light Blue is Best for it Belongs To Thoughtful People

NEW YORK, Feb. 2—If you are in love wear pink.

If you are sad, wear gray.

If you want to concentrate, wear light blue, the shade belonging to thoughtful people.

If you want to be happy, wear light green. This shade reflects happiness.

If the 500 members of the Century Theatre Club who interestedly listened to William F. Fraetas of Cape Town, South Africa and London, heed his statements concerning the influence of colors upon one's personality, their play of emotions will be reflected in the gowns they don.

Here is what Mr. Fraetas told his fair hearers:

"Every little color has a meaning all its own. That you should know and always wear your color is of the utmost importance to you. The man or woman who has made a failure of his or her life will, upon inspection and reflection, discover that the ill-chosen colors they wore vibrated to disaster and failure."

**Black Good for Some**

Mr. Fraetas said he had been making a scientific study of colors in their relation to the spiritual, psychological and physical life for the last 15 years, and had perfected a machine which would register these various vibrations from the finger tips.

"If you have the blues, no doubt you need to change your colors," said the lecturer. "If you have had a run of bad luck you have got on some other person's colors. Black is good for some persons, absolutely deadly for others.

"Some colors are absolute poison to some natures. Physicians, particularly physicians of Germany, pay great attention to colors that surround their patients. In sanitariums, especially where mental treatment is given, eminent physicians of Germany take into consideration the apartments.

"I know a woman who suffered from nervous depression. The 'color' physician, after a visit to her home, ordered her to change the bright red tones that prevailed in the furnishings to yellow. The latter was healing to her and she recovered at once, while the red was poison to her."

**Red's Baneful Influence**

The lecturer described the effect of color upon one's material success by saying: "I recently attended a reception at a magnificent home of a Wall street broker. Bright red predominated in the furnishings. There was too much red. During the evening a woman robed in bright red came in. I feared for this collision of colors. It was certain to bring on disaster. The next day the stock market went to smash, and the man's fortune with it."

The lecturer brought forth a broad smile of satisfaction from the suffragettes when he declared that the yellow they had chosen was excellent, as it vibrated to power and certain success.

The lecturer declared that not one man out of a thousand wore the shade of necktie to correspond with his spiritual self, and not one woman out of a thousand wore colors that vibrated to her higher self, and attracted success, love and happiness.

The lecturer went on to say that the world had progressed through various stages, from the original color, red, which represented primitive warfare, through the Roman Empire, when the violet shades predominated, and a new era of civilization came in, down to the present day of dark blue shades, reflecting the intellectual shades.

In conclusion he said:

New York hotels, restaurants, churches and public halls, are largely furnished in dark green, said the speaker. "New York vibrates to dark green. This represents great activity, great unrest."

"To a nervous person, sitting for a long time in such surroundings, the result is bad. The time is near at hand, when the dead set and iron bound system of illumination of the present day will pass and an advanced and higher system of lighting will be installed. This system will automatically change the colored lights in halls and rooms in accordance with the changing hours. Remember that every moment of time as well as tone vibrates to its own special color."
