

# SAYS GARBAGE DUMP IS BAD

Curtis to Lockhart; South Front from Broadway to Lockhart; Ninth street from Commercial to Anderson; Kruse avenue from Broadway to Font. The new grades differ considerably from the existing conditions on many of these streets.

Street Commissioner Lawhorne was instructed to open a ditch to drain that portion of Railroad addition where the dredge Oregon filled and stopped the old drains.

Mayor Straw was not present last evening, being out of town. President Allen presided. Councilman Powers arrived late as a result of his motorboat getting stranded on the mud flats across the Bay and necessitating his rowing in.

The Council adjourned to meet February 12.

## Stop Careless Shooting.

Marshal Carter was instructed to stop careless shooting by boys in the suburbs. Councilman Ferguson reported that there had been many complaints at Ferndale and just the other day a Mr. Fresno had a horse seriously injured by a stray bullet. The shooting of fire arms within the city limits is absolutely forbidden.

I. S. Kaufman renewed his request for the city to dedicate a strip about six feet wide to him and other property owners along the west side of South Fourth street, near Golden avenue. Fourth street is supposed to be 80 feet wide there, but through a defective survey is 86 feet wide part of the way and Mr. Kaufman and the other property owners want the jog taken out of the street. The matter is in a rather complicated condition and City Attorney Goss was instructed to look into the matter further.

Capt. Alex. Hall, of the ferry Transit, was present and asked permission to build a small addition to the ferry waiting-room to provide sleeping quarters for an employe. The matter was referred to the water front committee with power to act.

Henry Sengstacken was present and renewed his request for permission to move the old frame building, near Third and Market. He said that as the Elks had moved their buildings and none of them were in jail, he would like to have the same privilege accorded him. Councilman Ferguson said that the Council could not do anything about the matter as Mayor Straw controlled the situation through his right of veto.

News of Coos County Sent as Told By the Sentinel.

At the meeting of Coquille Lodge No. 69 of the Farmers' Educational and Co-operative Union of North America, which was held last Saturday, the following county officers were elected: H. B. Burns, president; H. S. Stephens, vice president; Mrs. R. A. Wallace, secretary; Geo. Heninger, chaplain, and A. T. Train, conductor.

G. J. Lemanski, who has secured a lease of The Dime Theater and will open it to the public soon after the expiration of the present lease on the property, was in town last Saturday.

William L. Massie and Edith May Jewett were united in marriage by Judge E. D. G. Holden last Saturday. Both contracting parties are from Bandon.

H. B. Guthery, of Los Angeles, Cal., who arrived on the Breakwater, is here to complete arrangements for the opening up of the coal properties, known as the Pike properties, two miles down the river. He has with him J. A. Swedberg, a mining engineer, graduate of the Utah School of Mines, who has recently been connected with the Colorado Fuel & Iron Co. of Denver and with the Burlington Railway mines in Wyoming. Mr. Swedberg is now making a mineral survey of the property and outlining plans of development, bunkers, docks and shipping facilities for the plant. Mr. Guthery is devoting his time to the transportation end of the business and has already arranged with Los Angeles, San Francisco and Portland parties for the sale of the output of the mine. The company is to be known as the Fulaski Coal & Navigation company. The output of the property has already been arranged for with Los Angeles and San Francisco markets.

## FOR SOCIALIST PAPER

Delegates at Coquille Meeting Decide in Favor of it.

The Socialists of Coos County held their first county convention in Coquille last Saturday. The meeting was called principally for the purpose of discussing ways and means for establishing a newspaper in this county to become the organ for the party in this district and the direct means of furthering the party propaganda.

There were in all 19 delegates present, representing all cities and towns in the county. By unanimous vote it was decided that an initial sum of \$5000 be raised at once for the purpose of establishing a Socialist paper. All matters of detail were left to be decided at an early date in the future. It is understood that arrangements will be made with some newspaper office in one of the cities in the county to print the paper until a complete plant can be secured.

The delegates were said to represent about 1300 party members or sympathizers in the county that could be counted on for support in the undertaking.

# GAME WARDENS HOLD MEETING

Must Know Something About Birds and Animals.

MEDFORD, Or., Feb. 5.—Under a new order of things, the fish and game wardens of Jackson, Josephine, Douglas, Coos and Curry Counties must possess a working knowledge of the birds of the air, the beasts and the inhabitants of the waters and of the land, their habits, their ways, the color of their plumage, and be able to distinguish songsters from non-singers. It is the plan of State Game and Fish Warden Finley to place the guardians of the woods and fields in the open seasons beyond the pale of nature faking. The policy was announced at the meetings of the wardens with their chief here this week.

Furthermore, the wardens must be prepared to jump from one end of their district to the other, on short notice, and be ready, pen in hand, to take an examination on state game laws. The knowledge of legal lore will come in handy in arguments, and no definite station is intended to keep the hunters without the exact location of game guardians. The rules for the coming season are more rigid than heretofore.

Under this system the state is expected to receive a large range of data on animal and bird life, with better protection to protected birds and animals and better regulations for the hunters.

## WILL SURVEY HARBOR

Lines at Florence Are Said to Be Irregular.

The Portland Journal says: "Another survey of the harbor at Florence is to be made soon by the engineers under Major J. J. Morrow, corps of engineers, U. S. A., in order to establish proper harbor lines. It was stated that Assistant Engineer W. G. Carroll has received authority to make the survey as soon as other work will allow.

"William Kyle, a prominent canneryman and merchant, of Florence, was in Portland yesterday and visited the office of Major Morrow in the interests of the Siuslaw. Mr. Kyle said that the wharves were very irregular and it is the desire of the people to get these straightened out so that there will be a regular harbor line with all of the wharves extending out in a uniform manner.

Mr. Kyle said that preparations for the work on the new south jetty at the mouth of the Siuslaw are progressing rapidly and the quarry and wharves are being made ready with all possible dispatch.

"All the prospects for the future of the Siuslaw look good," said Mr. Kyle yesterday, "and in addition to the salmon industry a large amount of lumber will be shipped from there. The new \$1,000,000 mill for the Wendling, Johnson Lumber Company, at Acme, is under construction now, the old mill turning out the lumber for the construction of the new. The new mill is two miles above Florence.

"Work on the tunnel on the branch of the Southern Pacific from Eugene to Coos Bay, located about 40 miles from the Siuslaw River, has been started and about 300 men are employed. When this is completed the Siuslaw will be greatly benefited."
