The injunction was issued on a petition to the Department of Justice which alleges several thousand papers and documents used in the government's criminal prosecution of the "Wire Pool" last fall had been destroyed.

One portion of the government's petition seems susceptible of interpretation that criminal indictments and prosecutions of certain officers of the steel corporation and its subsidiaries are under consideration by the Department of Justice.

TO ARREST ALL AT SAME TIME

Government Agents Keep Men Accused of Dynamite Plot Under Surveilance.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Feb. 7 .-Instructions have been sent to government agents in at least twenty cities today to keep watch over the men charged in the thirty-two indictments with complicity with the Mc-Namaras and Ortic McManigal in the dynamite conspiracy. The men indicted are said to number between thirty and forty and to be scattered in cities as far distant as Boston, New York, New Orleans, Chicago, Salt Lake, San Francisco and Seattle.
