A JUDGE'S REFRESHING VIEWS ON PUBLICITY.

A FEW days ago a New Jersey judge, in sentencing a man to a long term in the penitentiary in a case in which the prosecuting witness was a young girl, was emphatic in declaring that the newspapers were remiss in not giving more publicity to such crimes.  
"Little seems to be known of the character of these cases by the general public," he said, "probably because they are mentioned in the newspapers as 'statutory offenses.' It will probably serve public interests a great deal better to have the facts of crimes of this nature spread broadcast."

It is refreshing to have a judge take the same viewpoint of publicity that the newspapers do, even if he does go farther than the average publisher thinks will conserve the public welfare, says an exchange. His are not cured by shutting the eyes to them. It is as reasonable for society to shrink from contemplation of crime which it is in a measure responsible for as it would be for a man to refuse to look at or recognize the existence of a cancer on his body.

### 12 AMERICANS ARE DETAINED

ASSISTANTS OF MORGAN SHUSTER AS TREASURER GENERAL OF PERSIA HELD TO EXPLAIN SHORTAGE.  
(By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.)  
ST. PETERSBURG, Feb. 13.—The Persian government has telegraphed orders to Enzel and mosat instructing them to detain F. E. Cairns and 11 other Americans formerly on the staff of Morgan Shuster, the ex-Treasurer General of Persia, according to dispatch received this evening by the Novoye Vremya from Teheran. Cairns and the former assistants will be required, the newspaper dispatch says, to answer the irregularities which the Persian officials allege they have discovered in the accounts of Shuster while he acted as Treasurer General.

She has been living at the Russell apartments on West Washington street, and it was here the romance began two years ago when Walter McCredie, Eugene Krapp and Jess Garrett, members of the Portland team, rented apartments in the same building.
