THE announcement that Maurice Maeterlinck intends to establish a literary prize with the proceeds of his Nobel award, suggests a commendable spirit of appreciation and a desire to benefit others in a way that may be broadly helpful and encouraging.

The Nobel prize amounted to \$37,550 and M. Maeterlinck will increase this so as to provide annually \$1600 or \$3200 biennially. He desires that the prize be awarded for the best work in the French language, whether literary, artistic or scientific.

Senator Hitchcock Scores United States for Actions Toward Colombia.

WASHINGTON, March 1.—The Senate adopted a resolution offered by Senator Hitchcock calling on President Taft to submit to the Senate all the correspondence with Colombia dealing with the acquisition of the Panama canal zone by the United States.

WASHINGTON, March 1.—"The conspiracy which resulted in the dismemberment of the Colombian republic occurred in the United States with the approval of the highest United States officials and the spoliation was largely in the interest of a combination of influential capitalists who controlled the French Panama Canal Company," declared Senator Hitchcock of Nebraska in the Senate today. The Randolph is due to return today from Bandon to load a cargo of general merchandise for Curry county.

The Excelsior arrived in this morning from San Francisco, bringing in considerable freight which she discharged at the Alliance dock.

The tug Gleaner came in today from Gardiner and will tow the schooner Lily to sea and also take a cargo of general merchandise back to Gardiner.

It is stated that the Bessie Dollar, the big steam schooner, is due in here between March 12 and March 15 to load a cargo of about 3,500,000 feet of lumber at the Smith mill for Shanghai, China.
