## PLAN TO BUILD NEW RAILWAYS

President Sproule of Southern Pacific Announces 746 Miles of Construction.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 6.—The Examiner printed the following railroad news:

"President Sproule, of the Southern Pacific, has ordered the immediate construction of the Fernley Northern railroad from Fernley, a station on the Central Pacific, in Nevada, thirty-five miles east of Reno, to a point twenty miles north of Susanville, in northeastern California, a distance of 124 miles. Bids are invited from contractors today. The estimated cost of the project is \$5,000,000.

"The new line is to have a branch twelve miles long to the timber holdings, said to amount to 500,000 acres, of T. B. Walker, Minneapolis lumber king. The cost of this piece of road is estimated at \$500,000.

"This project is part and parcel of a \$30,000,000 program by which the Southern Pacific is to trench itself in Southern Oregon, northeastern California and northwestern Nevada against the encroachments of both the Western Pacific and the Hill system.

"It also means that the Southern Pacific, which already has all other parts of California well covered by a network of lines, is at last to fortify itself in the same way in the only remaining part of the state it has not yet invaded—the northeastern counties.

**746 Miles of New Road.**  
"The expensive program of railroad defense and traffic aggression includes seven miles. They call for a total of 746 miles of new railroad, the lowest estimate of their aggregate, the cost being \$29,740,000. The seven properties are:

## HARBORS AND RIVERS BILL

List of Appropriations for the Pacific Northwest is Announced.

WASHINGTON, March 4.—The river and harbor bill carries the following items for the Northwest:  
Mouth of Columbia river, \$1,000,000.

- Celilo canal, \$600,000.
- Columbia and Willamette below Portland, \$150,000.
- Willamette, above Portland and Yamhill, \$20,000.
- Tillamook bay, \$200,000.
- Willamette, Portland to Oregon City, \$10,000, and \$2500 additional for maintenance.
- Columbia, Celilo to mouth of Snake, \$30,000.
- Snake river, \$25,000.
- Siuslaw, \$5000.
- Coos river, \$3000.
- Tillamook, maintenance old project \$5000.
- Clatskanie, \$1000.
- Columbia, Bridgeport to Kettle Falls, \$25,000.
- Lewis river, \$6500.
- Skagit river, \$15,000.
- Puget Sound and tributaries, \$25,000.
- Hogulam river, \$12,000.
- Tillamook bay and Willamette to Oregon City are new items secured through the efforts of Representative Hawley.

The report on Yaquina bay, while favorable, has not been printed, and the committee has made it a rule to adopt no projects on which it had not the full report before it. The engineer board has not yet reported on the Nehalem river, and for that reason that project could not be provided for by the House committee. If these reports are available in time, Hawley will offer amendments while the bill is before the House.

The river and harbor bill does not carry appropriations for continuing contracts. These will be provided for in the sundry civil bill, which will contain the following additional amounts:

- Columbia and Willamette below Portland, \$320,000.
- Siuslaw river, \$115,500.
- Grays Harbor, \$500,000.
- Lake Washington canal, \$400,000.
- Bellingham harbor, \$52,250.
- Willapa Harbor, \$75,000.
- Snohomish river, \$75,000.
- The rivers and harbors appropriation bill, as a whole, carries \$25,965,010, the smallest amount since 1894. The largest of the improvement appropriations in the bill for rivers are: Ohio, \$5,400,000; Mississippi, \$5,950,000. Other large appropriations include: Oakland harbor, Cal., \$100,000; Humboldt harbor and bay, Cal., \$200,000.

### IN FAVOR OF PITNEY.

Senate Committee Favors New Jersey Man for Supreme Bench.

WASHINGTON, March 4.—The Senate judiciary committee today ordered a favorable report on the nomination of Mahon Pitney of New Jersey to be associate justice of the Supreme Court of the United States.

### REPORT SUGAR BILL.

## WATKINS FOR T. ROOSEVELT

The Redondo will sail next Saturday afternoon from San Francisco for Coos Bay.

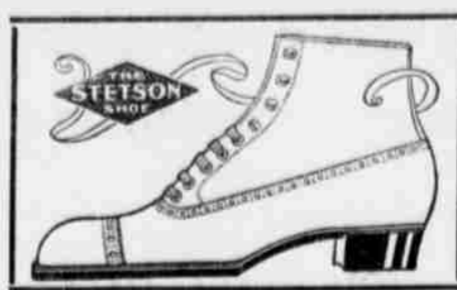
The Nann Smith arrived in from Bay Point this morning and will load at once at the Smith mill.
