NEW SCHOOL PLAN

THE new one session day plan inaugurated by the North Bend school board will be watched with great interest by educators and parents alike.

The new system while an innovation on Coos Bay, has been in successful operation in some of the large cities for some time. Under this plan school opens at 8 o'clock and closes for the day at 12:30 with intermission of 15 minutes for rest and recreation. There will be no curtailment of school work, the seven study periods remaining the same as under the old order.

It is claimed for the new plan that the clear brains and refreshed and rested physical condition enables children and teachers to accomplish more by continuous application in the early morning than the longer drawn out period with lunch hour intervening. The system has the endorsement of the medical profession and one prominent eastern professional man goes so far as to advocate two sleep periods not only for children but for grown ups, in the twenty-four hours.

"Everybody," says he, "should have two sleeps in twenty-four hours. The present system of working so many hours on end and sleeping solidly for another period is in many respects wrong. In my opinion the hours at which children work in school are wrong; they should never work in the afternoon, but in the early hours of the evening. Who is there that does not remember that clogged, heavy uncomfortable feeling one had as a child between 2 and 4 o'clock of an afternoon? Children should be allowed to sleep during that period; they would put more interest and intelligence into their work after such a siesta. So would the adult brain worker."

LICENSE OF ONE-EYED CAPTAIN IS RENEWED

Inspector Holds That Marine Hero, Partially Blind, Can Remain in Service.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 8.—Captain M. F. Cousins, one of the best known marine men on the Pacific coast, has been saved from retirement by a ruling that the loss of an eye no longer prevents a navigator from obtaining a renewal of his license. News of the decision, which was made by George Uhler, supervising inspector-general of hulls and boilers, was received here yesterday.

A protest has been made against renewal of the license of Captain Cousins, who wears a glass eye as a result of his heroism in the celebrated steamship Queen disaster. Uhler's ruling held that "any person who received a license prior to the adoption of the rule demanding a visual examination, may have such a license renewed for daylight only, if no other bar to such a renewal appears."

It was due to Captain Cousins' presence of mind that 100 persons were saved from death in the fire on the steamer Queen a decade or so ago. Captain Cousins is now in command of the steamship Governor.
