RUMOR FLYNN COMING HERE

Prominent Oklahoman to Move to Oregon—Political Rumor Denied.

When Dennis Flynn, the Oklahoma capitalist, was here a few weeks ago visiting his old friend, Col. Wm. Grimes, it was reported that he was seriously considering moving to the coast.

"The story about Mr. Flynn's political ambitions is purely a dream," said Mr. Grimes today. "Ever since I came west I have been urging him to come out here, where we have a country that far exceeds Oklahoma in climate and business opportunities."

The dispatch which is dated at Oklahoma City is as follows: Dennis T. Flynn, whose admirers used to call him "The Little Giant," in the days he was representing Oklahoma Territory, as its delegate to Congress, is said to have gone to Oregon to seek a new political career in that state.

Flynn's change of residence may hardly be overlooked by Oregon politicians. As a practical worker in politics Flynn is hardly adapted to making headway in getting into the game in new surroundings.

He led the fight that gave the Oklahoma delegation to William H. Taft four years ago and became a confidant of the president.

Flynn's highest ambition was to represent the state of Oklahoma in the United States Senate, that he might round out his career by receiving the most honorable office within the gift of his constituents.

Flynn has been in Oregon for two or three months. Men who were closely identified with Flynn in Oklahoma politics are quite sure that he will locate at Portland.

TARIFF CASE IS DECIDED

Manufacturers Will be Able to Boost Duty on Foreign Goods.

WASHINGTON, March 12.—A decision of sweeping importance in the administration of the tariff law, declaring an importer can appeal from the assessment of duty by a collector of customs on the ground that the assessment is too low, was rendered today by the United States Court of Customs Appeals.

DEMURRER IS OVERRULED.

Judge Anderson Quickly Dismisses Answers in Dynamiting Case.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., March 12.—Demurrers to indictments against the forty-six defendants in the government's prosecution of the alleged dynamiting conspiracy were filed before Judge A. B. Anderson by counsel for the indicted men when they were arraigned today in federal court.

Judge Anderson interrupted the motion to quash the indictments on the ground of confusing multiplicity, declaring it "was absurd."

"These defendants," Judge Anderson said, "will never go to trial without thoroughly understanding what they are charged with. They will not be embarrassed or confused in this county. The motion is overruled."
