RUMOR FLYNN

Prominent Oklahoman to Move to Oregon - Political Rumor Denied.

When Dennis Flynn, the Oklahoma capitalist, was here a few weeks ago visiting his old friend, Col. Wm. Grimes, it was reported that he was seriously considering moving to the coast. The same report comes in a dispatch from Oklahoma City to the Portland Oregonian. The latter story contains a lot of submises intimating that politics is the cause of his moving west, but Col. Grimes and his other friends laugh at the story.

"The story about Mr. Flynn's political ambitions is purely a dream," said Mr. Grimes today. "Ever since I came west I have been urging him to come out here, where we have a country that far excels Oklahoma in climate and business opportunities. Mr. Flynn has been greatly impressed by these during his visits here and I am hoping that he will soon come west to make his home. There is not the slightest foundation for the wild political speculation in the Oregonian's story, some newspaper correspondent merely working on his imagination to make good reading."

The dispatch which is dated at Oklahoma City is as follows:

Dennis T. Flynn, whose admirers used to call him "The Little Giant," in the days he was representing Oklahoma Territory, as its delegate to Congress, is said to have gone to Oregon to seek a new political career in that state. Rumor of his going has been printed several times in Okla-homa newspapers in the last twelve months, and each time Flynn made denial that he intended leaving Okla-A number of his closest friends are now quite confident, however, that Flynn is leaving Oklahoma for good.

Flynn's change of residence may hardly be overlooked by Oregon politicians. As a practical worker in polities Flynn is hardly adapted to making headway in getting into the game in new surroundings. He is an unrivaled handshaker, with a marvelous faculty for remembering names and faces, and during the years he was in Congress from Oklahoma Territory he established a national acquaint-There is little doubt that in Oregon Flynn would seek election to the United State Senate, depending upon his old fighting leader, William Grimes, to help him over the rough places. In Oklahoma politics the combination of Flynn and Grimes was invincible until statehood came with democratic incumbent, who will also arraigned today in federal court. the addition of Indian Territory and its host of democratic voters. Grimes was a radical partisan and believing that Oklahoma had joined the "solid south" he was unwilling to live longnority. He went to Marshfield, Ore., in the Coos Bay country, and made heavy investments.

Confident of President. He led the fight Oklahoma delegation to William H. confidant of the president. He maintained this friendly relation with President Taft after going to Oregon. Grimes was never a seeker of elective office, preferring to manage canpaigns and land successful candi-

Flynn's highest ambition was to represent the state of Oklahoma in The April issue of "The Railroad the United States Senate, that he might round out his career by receiving the most honorable office within the gift of his constituents. But things went badly in Oklahoma after statehood for Flynn's ambition. Not only did the democratic party gain control of the state government, with majorities in both houses of the legislature, but a "grandfather" suffrage law was enacted as an amendment to the state constitution, whereby the negro voters of Oklahoma were practically disfranchised, and the republican party shorn of much of its strength. Rather than remain as a politician without a job, Flynn engaged in the practice of law, and his firm was perhaps the most prosperous in Oklahoma.

Flynn has been in Oregen for two or three months. Mon who were closely identified with Flynn in Oklahome politics are quite sure that he Grimes himself will move from Marshfield to Portland.
