Winston Spencer Churchill Outlines Plans for Great Britain.

(By Associated Press to the Coos Bay Times.)

March 19-Winston Spencer Churchill, first lord of the admiral, introduced today in the House of Commons the naval estimates for the coming year. The appropriation called for amounts to \$220,427,000, a decrease of \$1,585,-000 from last year. Lord Churchill accompanied the

introduction with a promise of an augmentation of British naval construction to correspond with Germany's naval programme. He said he regretted the necessity of referring specifically to Germany.
