

TRY TO GET PLANTS HERE

Chamber of Commerce Making Systematic Campaign for New Industries.

The Marshfield Chamber of Commerce is now making a systematic campaign to secure new industries for the Bay. Owing to the great timber resources of this section and the cheap water transportation, the campaign at present is being concentrated on woodworking establishments. This week personal letters were sent to 1,200 woodworking establishments throughout the United States calling attention to the advantages of this section and copies of the special edition of The Times were mailed to each of them.

The Chamber of Commerce has arranged for the distribution of all of the 5,000 copies of The Times. C. G. Chapman of the Portland Commercial club in a letter acknowledges the receipt of 500 copies which he says he will place advantageously.

The following is the text of the letter to the woodworking establishments:

"If you contemplate a removal of your manufacturing operations within the next few years, we invite your attention to the claims of Coos Bay as being best adapted to the economical manufacture and transportation of timber products, on the Pacific coast.

"Within a radius of seventy-five miles of Coos Bay are one hundred and forty billion feet of standing timber, with the greatest variety on the Pacific coast, much of which can now be acquired at a price of one dollar, or less, per thousand feet stumpage.

"Coos Bay, fourteen miles in length, now accommodates vessels carrying three and one-half million feet of lumber, has a mud bottom and at a small cost is being dredged to accommodate the largest ocean-going vessels.

"The Southern Pacific company has under construction a railroad from Eugene, Oregon, to Coos Bay. We are mailing you a copy of the Coos Bay Times, which gives more detailed information. Should you feel interested, we invite correspondence."

MORTGAGES NOT TO BE ASSESSED

Assessor Thrift Not Enumerating Them as Taxable Property This Year.

For the first time in many years, mortgages will not be assessed in Coos county this year. So if you hold any securities of this nature and forgot to enumerate them when the assessor was listing your taxable property, you can now feel relieved of being termed a "tax dodger."

At a recent conference of the assessors of Oregon, it was found that very few of the assessors were listing all the mortgages in their counties. Some were assessing only the ones that were turned in and not searching the records to make the assessment of mortgages complete.

Assessor Thrift had been making the mortgage assessments from the county records and in view of the fact that other counties was not doing the same and in consequence enumerating only a small portion of the securities there, he did not feel it was fair to Coos county money lenders that they should be treated differently. He said that after discussing the matter with Judge Hall and County Clerk Watson, he decided not to assess them this year.

It is estimated that the amount of money or rather securities that will be exempt from taxation this year in Coos county will be more than \$250,000.
