SUMMONS

IN THE CIRCUIT COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON, IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF COOS.
 John S. Coke and John K. Kollock, plaintiffs vs. H. A. Monday, defendant—Summons.
 To H. A. Monday, defendant above named:
 IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF OREGON:

You are hereby required to appear and answer or otherwise plead to the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit in the above entitled Court on or before Saturday, the 4th day of May, A. D. 1912, and if you fail to so appear and answer or otherwise plead to said complaint for want thereof, the plaintiffs will apply to the Court for the relief demanded in their complaint, a succinct statement of which is as follows:

1st. That you, H. A. Monday, be required to perform the conditions of your agreement to purchase entered into on the 16th day of October, A. D. 1906, by and between yourself and L. D. Kinney for the benefit of John S. Coke and John K. Kollock by the terms of which agreement you agreed and promised to purchase and pay for Lots one (1) and two (2) in Block forty-seven (47) of the Townsite of Coos Bay, Plat B, Coos County, Oregon, according to the plat thereof on file and of record in the office of the County Clerk of Coos County, Oregon, and that you be required to pay to the plaintiffs herein or into Court for the use of the plaintiffs above named, the sum of Three Hundred Seventy-five (\$375) Dollars now due under the provisions of said agreement, together with interest thereon at the rate of 6 per cent per annum from the 16th day of October, A. D. 1906, to date, within ten (10) days from the time of entering a decree against you or within such time as the Court may deem reasonable.

2nd. And in case you fail to do within the time designated by the Court, that you and all persons claiming any right, title or interest in said real property, by, through or under you, be foreclosed and forever debarred of any and all right or redemption or equity in said real property.


