first mistake was made in the insertion of that kind of a notice provision in the Port Law; the second mistake was made in not complying with such provision after the same had been inserted.

Am preparing a petition for rehearing and in addition to asking a change in the decision, shall ask for a ruling on other questions involved, to the end that the future Port may not have to litigate these questions before a bond issue and sale. Shall also ask that the Supreme Court delay the taking effect of its decision for a few weeks to enable the Port to complete its unfinished business and wind up its affairs.
