SHORT HISTORY OF THE W. C. T. U.

The Women's Christian Temperance Union is an organization of Christian women banded together for the protection of the home, the abolition of the liquor traffic and the triumph of Christ's Golden Rule in custom and in law.

It is the descendant of the Women's Crusade of 1873 when the women of a few Iowa towns met in the streets to pray and marched two by two into the saloons begging those who sold and those who drank to cease doing so.

The thrilling story of the success of the crusade is a matter of history. It was soon recognized, however, that the saloon was but the outcropping of the liquor system, protected by law and entrenched in the very heart of our government; so, legal as well as moral suasion was found to be necessary. The National W. C. T. U. was organized in 1874 and incorporated in 1883. It is now organized in every state in the union, district of Columbia, Alaska, Canal zone, Hawaii, the Philippines and locally in 15,000 towns and cities. It is the largest society composed exclusively of women and conducted entirely by them.

In 1877 a knot of white ribbon was adopted as a badge. In 1883 the World's W. C. T. U. was organized by Frances E. Willard and the first eight round the world missionaries were sent out by the National W. C. T. U.

Eight world's conventions have been held as follows: Boston, Mass.; 1891; Chicago, Ill., 1893; London, Eng., 1895; Toronto, Can., 1897; Boston, 1906; and Glasgow, Scotland, 1910.

It is now organized in fifty nations with over half a million members. Countess Carlisle is President and Mrs. Lillian Stevens, our National president, is vice-president at large. Its motto: "For God, and Home, and Every Land."
