GROWTH OF POSTAL SAVINGS

TWENTY million dollars in money, most of which has been kept in secret hiding places, has been deposited in postal savings banks and the officials at Washington in charge of the system say they expect the total to reach \$30,000,000, or possibly \$40,000,000, before the end of this year.
