## MAKING MARSHFIELD A CITY BEAUTIFUL

Plans for the "City Beautiful" contest and the children's gardening contest have been completed by the special committee of the Marshfield Improvement Club, which has the matter in charge. The following is a statement of the rules and regulations of the contest:

**Contest for Adults and Children.**  
Members of the same home may enter but two of the eight.

**City districts:**

- No. 1—Ferndale, north of Date street.
- No. 2—Date to Commercial.
- No. 3—Commercial to Donnelly.
- No. 4—Donnelly to Flanagan.
- No. 5—Flanagan south and east of Seventh.
- No. 6—Flanagan south and west of Seventh.

The prizes are as follows.

\$50 for the greatest improvement made in the appearance of the entire home premises within the city limits.

\$10 to be awarded in each of the six districts for the best kept old lawn in the district.

\$10 to be awarded in each of the six districts for best new lawn, seeded or sodded this season.

\$5 to be awarded in each of the six districts for the best street parking, seeded, sodded or improved this season.

\$5 in each of the six districts for the most improved back yard through the planting of vines and shrubbery.

\$5 in each of the six districts for the most beautiful window box.

\$5 in each of the six sections for the greatest improvement in vacant or unoccupied lot.

\$5 in each of the six districts for the finest display of roses on bushes.

**Prize Contest for Children Only.**  
Open to children under 16 years of age.

**Vegetable Garden Contest—**Size 10 feet by 20 feet or over.

**Flower Garden Contest—**Size 24 square feet or over.

**Rules:**  
1.—Each child must do the work in preparing his garden. The ground may be plowed or spaded by some one else if desired.

2.—One or both contests may be entered.

**Prizes—**(Same for both contests).  
First.—Ten dollar camera.

Second.—Rainy weather outfit; southwest, coat, boots.

Carrots (Both classes).—Bunch of six from each exhibitor.

Muskmelons (Both classes).—One from each exhibitor.

Celery (Both classes).—One bunch from each exhibitor.

Turnips (Both classes).—One bunch of six from each exhibitor.

Parsley (Both classes).—Bunch from each exhibitor.

Strawberries (Both classes).—One quart from each exhibitor.

Bagas (Both classes).—One peck from each exhibitor.

Onions (Both classes).—One peck from each exhibitor.

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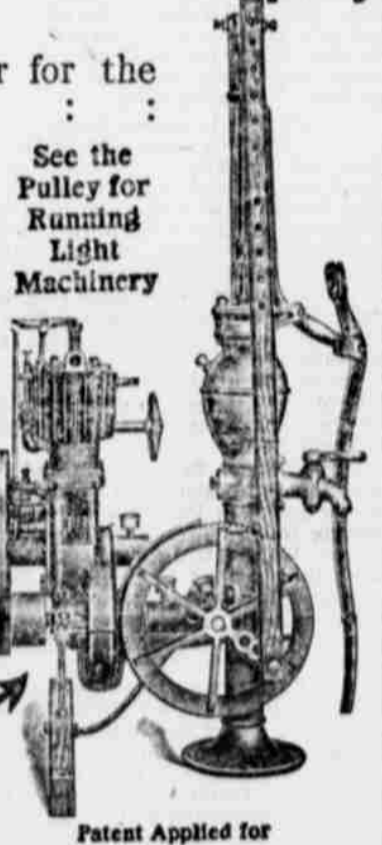
