

G. X. WENDLING TELLS PLANS

Announces He Will Build Big Mill On Lower Siuslaw In Near Future.

PORTLAND, Ore., May 8.—Talking of billions of feet of standing timber, F. X. Wendling at the Portland spoke optimistically of the future of the lumber industry on the Pacific coast. For the next few years at least he predicted a large business. Mr. Wendling calls San Francisco his home, but has interests in Oregon that total millions of dollars, including large holdings at Klamath Falls and a number of townsite locations that have passed the boom stage. He said:

"I am now devoting my attention particularly to my holdings in the Siuslaw district, where I have had for some time 800,000,000 feet of standing timber and have just closed a deal for 500,000,000 feet more. In addition to this I have options on 2,000,000,000 feet more and want to increase my total holdings in that district to 4,000,000,000 feet of standing timber.

"The project is to erect a mill at Acme, at the mouth of the Siuslaw river, that will have a capacity of 150,000,000 feet of sawed timber annually.

Railroad Work Progresses.

"The Southern Pacific is pushing the construction of the railroad from Eugene to Marshfield, by the way of Acme, and it will be completed within a couple of years, which will give us an output to the interior. During the same period the improvement of the entrance to the Siuslaw river will be completed by the government, which will give at least 20 feet on the bar at mean low water and afford us all the opportunities necessary for shipping coastwise and foreign.

"There is one thing, or rather two, that will have a very large influence on the expected prosperity in the lumber market, and they are these. First, President Taft must be elected, for it will give confidence to the stability of the government as has existed during his present term.

EUGENE RAILWAY NEWS

More Material and Equipment for Coos Bay Line.

EUGENE, Ore., May 8.—The Guard says: Material in large quantities is arriving for the new Coos Bay line of the S. P. Saturday evening two cars of rail joints and one of concrete boards arrived and yesterday two cars of plate ties and another of concrete boards came in. The heavy rails for the main line are not yet on hand but have been shipped and will be here by the time that the yard and switch are completed.

Now that the good weather seems to have begun in earnest, the engineers and contractors say that the work of building the new road will progress much faster than ever before.

There was sidetracked at Eugene yesterday a large locomotive bearing the inscription, "Sud Pacific de Mexico," which, interpreted into the English language, means "Southern Pacific of Mexico." The engine was a large coal burner and was "dead," being hauled that way either north or south, it is not learned which. It had disappeared this morning, and it is not known why it was sidetracked here. Some thought yesterday it might have been sent to Eugene to haul the work train which will soon be put on the new Coos Bay line.

PLAT PERHAM'S PARK ADDITION

New Tract In West Marshfield Is Placed On Market—Street Plans.

"Perham's Park Addition," is the name that E. G. Perham has conferred on the tract in northeast Marshfield which he recently purchased from the Southern Oregon company. The plat of the new addition was filed with the county clerk at Coquille a few days ago.

In platting the tract, the streets were laid out according to the contour of the land, instead of the usual way. As a result better grades will be secured for the streets in the addition and it will also be made more slightly when they are improved.

The tract is now being cleared and Mr. Perham is making arrangements to grade some of the principal streets through the tract this summer. He has arranged to open a street eighty feet wide through the tract north and south which will connect with Sherman avenue, North Bend, and Eleventh street in Marshfield, making a through thoroughfare. With this exception, the streets in the addition will be sixty feet wide.

The first street to be graded will be Eighth terrace, which will run northwesterly from Eighth street in West Marshfield to Tenth street and then Tenth will be opened northward to the edge of the tract. He also plans to open a street east and west through the center of the tract this summer.

The corner lots are mostly 50 x 100 and the inside lots 40 x 100 feet.

Compulsory Attendance of Children There May Be Required.

The bill would require every child in Alaska between the ages of eight and sixteen, whether of white or mixed blood, to attend one of the United States public schools or some other school where English is taught. Exceptions are made in the case of children who are forced to work to support their parents or guardians.
