THE United States commissioner of education has reported upon the status of educational training throughout the country in a way that allows optimistic reassurance.

Compulsory training in at least the rudiments of learning is exacted in many states. In some, where the child's labor is really needed by the parents, he is paid by the state for the time spent in the schoolroom.

This recognition of the duty which the state owes its citizens of providing an educational safeguard and insisting upon it with measures which make the acquisition easy is a most encouraging development.
