Spruce Giant Weighed Over 80 Tons and Scales Over 19,600 Feet.

The largest log ever hauled on a train anywhere and one of the largest ever brought out was brought from the Smith-Powers Camp No. 2 on Isthmus Inlet last week to the C A. Smith mill. The monster log is estimated to have weighed over eighty tons and scaled 19,600 feet of lumber.

The giant was a spruce. It was seventy-eight feet long, seven feet in diameter at the butt-end and sixtyeight inches in diameter at the top. Scaled as five sixteen-foot logs, it is estimated to have contained ovr 19,-
