Meeting at Chamber of Commerce Decides to Have Work Done at Once.

At a meeting of the Marshfield Chamber of Commerce this morning, steps were taken for the immediate repair of the bulkhead in front of Ferndale.

The matter was called to the attention of Dr. McCormac of the Marshfield Chamber of Commerce by Engineer Leefer.

After discussing the matter, a resolution was passed authorizing A. H. Powers who has been looking after the dredge work for the Chamber of Commerce to go ahead and have the bulkhead repaired immediately under the direction of City Engineer Gidley.

REDUCE AUTO SPEED LIMIT

Council to Keep Them Down to Ten Miles Per Hour—Damage Roadways.

City Attorney Goss last evening was instructed by the council to draft an ordinance limiting the speed of automobiles in the city to ten miles per hour.

The action of the council followed a lengthy discussion of the matter. It was brought up by a report of City Street Inspector Lawhorne that the speeding autos were raising havoc with the plank streets.

Not only the damage to the streets but the danger of the speeding machines was discussed. Marshal Carter reported that he had been informed that some of the machines had speeded up to forty-nine miles per hour Sunday.

Whether the state law or an ordinance should be invoked was a question raised but it was finally decided to amend the present ordinance and reduce the speed limit to a point so that there will be no question about ability to convict the violators.

To License Autos Hugh McLain appeared before the council last night and inquired if there was not some way of licensing autos so that the local machines would be protected from outside autoists coming in here on celebrations and participating in the harvest.

City Attorney Goss said that outside machines could not be taxed or licensed unless the local ones were. He suggested that the autos for hire be required to pay an annual license and this would prevent outside machines coming in here for a day or two.

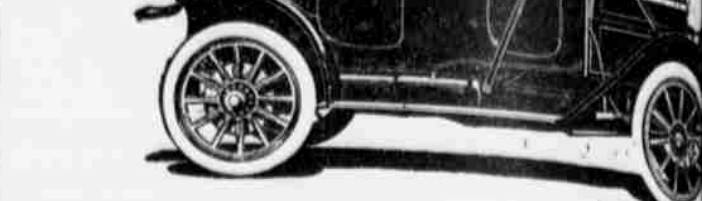
