TALKS ON TEMPERANCE

Mrs. Silbough Delivers Interesting Address in Marshfield

Editor Times:

The most interesting meeting in the history of the Marshfield W. C. T. U. was held at the Baptist church Sunday night. Mrs. Elijah Kelly, president of the local union, presided and introduced Mrs. Jackson Silbough of Seattle, Wash. Mrs. Silbough is a woman of great ability and retained the intense attention of her audience for over sixty minutes. In the course of the evening she said: "The white ribbon band of women is not the enemy of the saloon MAN but his business. We fight it because it tears from the devoted wife her husband and makes him into a drunken brute; it takes from the loving mother her dear son and turns him into a disappointing failure that not only destroys his physical life but loses his own soul. Oh, why can't mothers and fathers wake up to this awful fact? Every 5 minutes that you live some mother's once innocent boy fills a drunkard's grave. How do you know but what some time this open grave may claim for its victim your own son, who has fallen into the gutter through the licensed saloon on your most prominent street? Do the saloon keepers like the products of their own business? No, no, no. While the man is a moderate drinker he is invited into the saloon, but when he becomes drunk he is kicked out of the saloon and often put in jail. Does the saloon man who respects his family want his wife and pure children to live in the saloon district? Indeed not. Their's would be the first vote against a saloon near their house. Adolphus Bush, the rich brewer of St. Louis, who has made all his wealth thru liquor, when he wanted a beautiful home went to the prohibition town of Pasadena, Calif. He don't like the products of his own business."

Mrs. Silbough also discussed the awful, awful growth of the White Slave Traffic. "Mothers you may not be in great danger here but can't you lift a hand to help the mothers of the city? Not only the carelessly protected girl but the most beautiful daughters of our homes are in danger when upon the streets of the city. Only last week while the daughter of a prominent citizen was going home from school a rushing auto dashed up by her, she was instantly snatched into the machine where were four men who carried her off to a deserted house. I could tell you hundreds of such cases that I know are positively true and I was one of the twelve white ribbon women who with four stalwart men went into the restricted district of Seattle and there found imprisoned girls as young as twelve years of age. Think fathers, think mothers what if it had been your darling bright eyed daughters that you love so well. Brothers, sisters, can't you get to work; put your shoulders to the wheel and rid your town of these two evils that go hand in hand, the saloon and the restricted district?"

Mothers wept and fathers shuddered at the thought of such vices surrounding their children. Fourteen new members were added to the local temperance union, four men and ten women and the collection was \$63, which will be used in the fight for "Clean Oregon."


