

OVER BRIDGE

THREATENED AT MEDFORD OVER CONTRACT SECURED BY E. G. PERHAM.

The Medford Sun contains the following which will be of interest on Coos Bay on account of E. G. Perham having secured the contract for the bridge involved:

"If you let the contract for this bridge I will visit Judge Calkins in Portland next week and ask that you show cause why a restraining order should not be issued against its

With these words Attorney E. D. Briggs of Ashland, acting as attorney for Benton Bowers, tried to get the county court to withhold the awarding of the bridge over Bear Creek at

Jacksonville Wednesday afternoon.
"I move," said Judge Neil, in the
mildest voice in the world, "that we award the contract to the lowest bidder, E. G. Perham of Marshfield, Oregon, and that the permanent contract be made up as soon as possible. This bridge is needed and we intend to place a time limit on its construc-

"I second the motion," said Commissioner Frank Brown.

Commissioner Owens then declared that he was in favor of letting the contract for the bridge go over for a year and let the next county court have the job.

"I believe the bridge would not compensate for the trouble that it will involve," said he. "We will have a fight on our hands and no one knows where it will end. I represent the minority and wish to be re-corded against the proposition."

"The next county court would find the same opposition that we find," said Judge Nell, "if this proposition is acceptable to the City of Medford,

then it should be accepted."

Mayor Canon being present duclared the proposition was acceptable and said the city would pay \$13,500 even though the price of the bridge was less than \$35,000. So the con-tract was awarded and Mr. Perham

Attorney Briggs seemed very muc gricved at the result and asked that the county clerk protect the members of the county court from trouble later on by reading into the minutes that

a vigorous protest had been filed. The precise reason for such action was not clear and County Clerk Coleman said that he was unable to write

man said that he was unable to write set speeches into the minutes, however much he might like to.

The upshot of the meeting was that unless the Ashland discontents relent and agree to some sort of compromise, the case will be tried by Judge Calkins, probably in a couple of months. Attorney Briggs acciared that it would mean the testing of the legality of all warrants outstanding exceeding the constitutional standing exceeding the constitutional
