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MOTOR BUS STREET CARS.

THE recent successful installation of automobile service between Marshfield and North Bend proves the growing use of the auto as a substitute for street cars.

Lord Montague, vice president of the Automobile Club of Great Britain and a student of transportation methods, has been noting traffic conditions in New York City and says that motor buses should be used in place of street cars.

The motorbus, in his opinion, has been developed until it is a better means of public transportation than the street car. It can be operated, he says, at a cheaper cost per passenger and per mile than the street car, owing to the fact that it needs no permanent way; it can take on and discharge passengers at the side of the street, and it can move more freely in the streets.

"The possibility of the motorbus supplanting the street car has been recognized by street railway men for several years," says the Chicago Record Herald. "If, as Lord Montague claims, nearly all those who have studied traffic problems in the older countries are losing their faith in tramcars and are turning their attention to the free-wheeled mechanical vehicle, it would be well for American cities to study the operation of the motorbus in Paris and London. Not to have tracks in the streets and not to have the noise of street cars would be a blessing to the public, to say nothing of the flexibility of operation possible with the motorbus."

The development of the motorbus as a passenger carrier will also serve small cities such as Marshfield where a regularly equipped street car business might not pay.

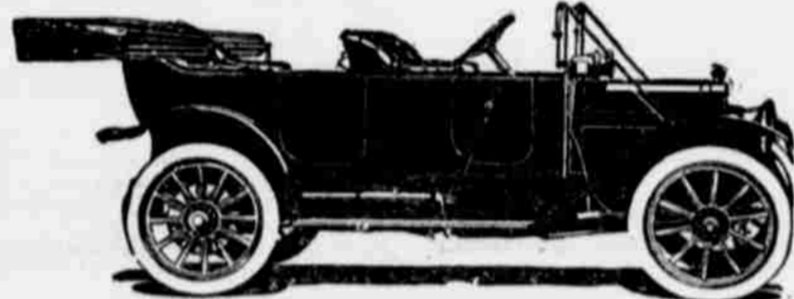
