## ORDERS WILL JOIN PARADE

### Plans for Fourth of July Celebration Progressing—Invite Others.

That more societies will participate in the Fourth of July parade in Marshfield this year than last was indicated today when several notified Chairman R. O. Graves that they would take part. Those notifying him were the Sons of Norway, the Elks' Lodge and the Linnea Society. Each has a large membership.

Mr. Graves has sent a letter to the North Bend city council asking them and the citizens of North Bend to participate. His letter is as follows: "Marshfield is going to celebrate the Independence of the United States by a three days' celebration commencing on the second day of July and ending at midnight on the Fourth of July. On behalf of the people of the city of Marshfield, I extend to the people of North Bend through your honorable body a most earnest invitation to attend our celebration and take part in our festivities with us. On the morning of July 4th, there will be a general parade in our streets. We particularly hope that your city will lend to us the presence of members of your municipal body, and as many of your various Sunday schools, Fraternal orders, Unions and other organizations as possible in this parade.

"Your municipal welfare, hopes and pleasures are our welfare, hopes and pleasures. Ours are yours. Both are Coos Bay's. Will your honorable body take such action as may be necessary to help in having the best celebration ever held on Coos Bay?"
