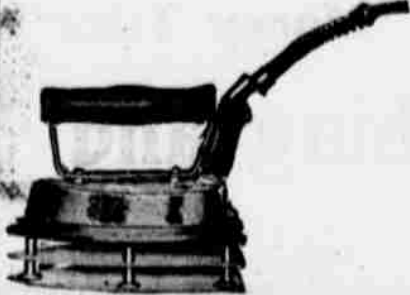

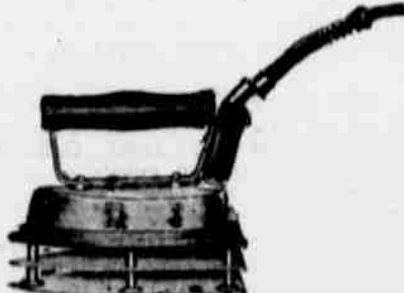

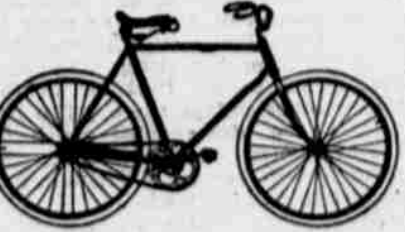

ALONG THE WATERFRONT

Orders are out requiring two wireless operators on all vessels going to sea and carrying 100 people, including crew, hereafter, and this will create a demand for more "sparks."

It was found recently that quite a large per centage of the graduating class of 1912 from the Naval Academy had not acquired the art of swimming; and until this is learned, diplomas will be withheld from those who have not qualified. The test requires a midshipman not only to know how to swim, but to swim for a period of five minutes at least by using a certain prescribed stroke.

THE RAILROAD LAND MATTER

CONGRESSMAN LAFFERTY EXPLAINS THE PRESENT STATUS OF THE SITUATION.

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 28.—So much has been published about the status of the celebrated "railroad lands" in Oregon, that were granted to the Oregon & California Railroad company that a correspondent recently requested Congressman Lafferty to give a concise and clear explanation of the status of those lands at the present time. In complying with this request, Mr. Lafferty said: **Law is Plain.**

"The law making the grant to the railroad company reads that the company shall sell the lands to actual settlers in quantities not greater than 160 acres to any one settler, and for prices not exceeding \$2.50 an acre. That law has never been amended or repealed.

"According to interpretation of that law, it gives to any citizen the right to go upon the lands and pick out a claim not exceeding a quarter of a section, and settle upon it without let or hindrance from the railroad company.

"It then becomes the duty of the settler to pay the railroad company (Oregon & California Railroad Company by name) which has its offices in the Wells-Fargo building Portland, the sum of \$2.50 per acre for the land stilled upon, and it becomes the duty of the company to accept the money and give the settler a deed.

"When the company refuses, the settler has done all he is required to do and no lawful power can put him off the land.

"A few settlers are now on the railroad lands. They have defied the railroad company to put them off. The railroad company will not attempt to do so, because a suit of ejectment against a settler would bring up before the court for immediate decision the very question that the company is trying to stave off as long as possible, to-wit, whether a settler has the right to take the law to mean what it says.

"At the request of the attorney general I now have a bill pending in the House providing that after its passage the railroad lands shall not be subject to settlement until after the suit to forfeit the lands to the government is determined, and that all lands, forfeited shall then be opened under the drawing system.

"But until that bill is passed there is nothing to prevent any citizen from taking possession of a railroad claim and establishing a home upon it. And if the bill should not pass at all the railroad lands will continue to be subject to settlement until every claim is covered by a bona fide settler.

"The object of the bill is to prevent a rush, and the resulting confusion and disorder, which might occur if the lands should remain vacant until a final decision by the supreme court.

"But if the bill does not pass and settlers should gradually take these lands up, pending the government litigation, they would undoubtedly be given a preference if a forfeiture to the government should be declared.

"If the railroad company should win, the settlers would have to get off the land at the end of the suit.

"It is this uncertainty that is keeping settlers off the railroad lands."
