### NORTH BEND IS VICTOR AGAIN

Eastside lost another game by one score to North Bend yesterday. It was a close exhibition from start to finish, the score being 5 to 4. Maloney and Clinton both pitched good ball and most of the runs scored against them came from poor support. Eastside keeps getting better all the time and Manager Whitty is signing up some good men.

North Bend started well and got in a run in the first inning. Eastside had a fine chance to score in the second with three men on bases and no outs but could not find the ball for a hit. In the third, however, the boys came to the front and scored twice, making it two to one in their favor. In the fourth North Bend chased in two runs on a hit and two errors and in the fifth Eastside got two as a result of two hits, two errors and a base on balls, the score standing 4 to 3 in favor of Eastside. In the eighth North Bend brought in two more, just enough to win the game.

Lewis has the reputation of being a hard hitter and kept the pitchers worried. He got a beautiful two bagger in the fifth, bringing in a run and then scored himself. Kissam got a three bagger in the eighth and Connors followed with a two-base hit and then scored the winning run.
