**COMMISSION MEETS**

Will Decide Upon Wage Demands of Railroaders.

NEW YORK, July 15 (Delayed in transmission.)—Members of the Arbitration Commission gathered at Manhattan Beach today to take up the question of the settlement of the wage demands of the locomotive engineers of fifty-two railroads east of Chicago and Ohio. The engineers demanded a total of \$7,500,000 annually. The locomotive firemen also asked a wage increase amounting to more than \$20,000,000 annually. The railroad interests say there will be other demands by train men.

Splendid Work Done at Big Meeting at Stockholm.

STOCKHOLM, July 15 (Delayed in transmission.)—The eight hundred meters swimming race for teams of four men each finals were Australia, first; United States, second; England, third. The best time was 10 minutes, 11 1/5 seconds. The 1500 meter relay, four men each, running 100 meters, final was United States, first; France, second; England, third. Hop, skip and jump final, Sweden, first, second and third.

The cross country race of 8000 meters, nearly five miles, resulted as follows, Finland, first; Sweden, second and third.

The high diving, plain and variety combined heights to five and ten meters, final: Adlerse of Sweden, 349 7-10 points, first; Zuener of Germany, 363 points, second; Blorgen, Sweden, 347 8-10 points, third.

In the cross-country race of teams the results were: Sweden, first; Finland, second; England, third.

The Decathlon result was: James Thorp, of Carlisle Indian school, first; H. W. Iseland, of Sweden, second; C. Lomberg, of Sweden, third.
