CHICAGO, July 26.—When Antipater, the epigrammatist of Sidon, wrote a guide book for western travelers in the eastern country, about two centuries before Christ, he prepared it with a list of seven wonders of the world. These, in Antipater's mind, no sightseer could afford to pass or at least fail to hear about. The selection has come down in history. It represents the most glorious achievements of man in the ancient time.

The publishers of Popular Mechanics recently sent out 10,000 letters to eminent scientists in Europe and America, and inclosed a ballot containing 56 subjects of scientific and mechanical achievement. The letter requested the learned men to cross out seven of the list which they thought were the seven "greatest wonders of the modern world," or supplement list or partial list of their own.

Seventy per cent of the letters returned responses. The ballots on the highest seven stood this way:

Wireless telegraphy, 244 votes;

telephone, 185; aeroplane, 167; radium, 165, antiseptics and antitoxins, 140; spectrum analysis, 126; X-ray, 111.

The three next highest achievements received this vote: Panama canal, 100; anesthesia, 94; synthetic chemistry, 81.

Dr. Theodore Paul of the royal university, Munich, Germany, checked the only ballot received marked for the seven titles which the total vote showed to have been selected. Six ballots, one from India, two from France, two from Germany and one from the United States, showed the selection of six of the final seven.

The ballot sent out contained the following list: Panama canal, wireless, linotype machine, printing press, camera, X-ray, locomotive, aeroplane, electric furnace, incandescent light, phonograph, colored motion pictures, skyscraper, automobile, hydroplane, turbine engine, spectrum analysis, antiseptics and antitoxins, anesthesia, modern ocean liner, sewing machine, threshing machine, reinforced concrete, subway transportation, submarine, battleship, electric transformer, discovery of north and south poles, telephone, telegraph, Eiffel tower, hydro-electric power, utilization of pneumatic power, typewriter, computing machine, color printing, steel, preventive medicine, synthetic chemistry, radium, Assuan dam, Simplon tunnel, ultraviolet rays, ultra-microscope, artificial ice, internal combustion engine, taking nitrogen from the air, Florida-Key West railroad, trans-Siberian railroad, ore smelter, science of eugenics, Catskill aqueduct, trans-Andean railroad, textile machinery, oxy-acetylene and oxy-hydrogen torches.

### BREWERY IN TANGLE

Roseburg Grand Jury Indicts Officials for Violation

ROSEBURG, Ore., July 24.—After investigation of three days the grand jury, late Saturday returned three joint indictments against the Roseburg Brewing & Ice company, a private corporation; Oscar Klinke, proprietor; and Joseph Heidenrich, manager of the local brewery plant, and Joseph Heidenrich, the brewery deliveryman.

Following the return of the indictment bench warrants were issued and the defendants were cited to appear in the circuit court for arraignment this morning. In each case the defendants are accused of violating the local option laws. In one indictment Heidenrich, Klinke and the brewery are charged with selling beer to Henry Andry, proprietor of a local soft drink emporium on July 3. In a second indictment the three defendants are accused of selling a similar product to C. H. N. Cronoid, of the McClallen hotel, on the 17. In the third indictment, the defendants stand charged with selling beer to C. C. Miller on July 3.
