The question of rural supervision is one which has been proposed by State School Superintendent Ackerman and has already met with considerable opposition. With this proposed regulation in force, the county would be divided into supervisor districts with a supervisor for each district. #### SCHOONER IS WRECKED

Crew of Seven Saved off C. T. Hill at Nehalem.

WHEELER, Or., July 31—The schooner C. T. Hill, which went on a sand spit three-quarters of a mile south of Nehalem bar as a result of having sailed in without a tug, is high and dry and all hope of getting her off safely has been abandoned.

Captain N. Parsons left the ship today and notified the underwriters to take charge. The George R. Vosburg crossed the bar at 9 o'clock and offered assistance, which was refused. The ocean is smooth and there is no immediate danger of the vessel going to pieces, but little hope for her lasting long if any wind should spring up.

On June 1, according to the canal record, 22,053,815 cubic yards or less than one-eighth of the total amount of earth and rock to be taken out of the canal route, remained to be excavated.
