COACH BOUND OVER

Bandon Man Released on \$2,000 Bond on Manslaughter Charge

BANDON, Aug. 2.—Joe Coach has been bound over under a \$2,000 bond by Justice C. R. Wade on the charge of manslaughter, growing out of the killing of Chas. C. Hadley here last Monday night. Coach furnished bond, his brother, Arthur Coach, and J. L. Kronenberg being his security. Soon after the coroner's jury brought in a verdict recommending that the grand jury investigate Hadley's death, it is said that some witnesses were found who claimed that they saw Coach strike Hadley. This resulted in Justice Wade ordering the arraignment of Coach.

DRAIN IS IMPROVING

Starts Macadamizing Streets and Good Roads Work.

DRAIN, Ore., Aug. 2.—The city council started work this morning on the second section of the work of macadamizing the streets of the city. The other section was completed by the city the fore part of the month to the city limits. Here the county road district officials took hold of the work and are extending the crushed rock roads both north and south on the Pacific Highway, and also westward on the country road to the coast.

Drain and vicinity are doing their part in carrying out the good-roads idea in a most substantial way. Upwards of \$50,000 has been expended on near-by roads recently, and the good work will be continued until this section has the best roads in the state.

UNIQUE SEA TRADE.

LUMBER RATES ARE ADVANCED

Portland-Los Angeles Tariff Highest In Years.

PORTLAND, Ore., July 31.—Another advance in coast freight rates on lumber has been announced between the Columbia river and Los Angeles which makes the highest rate between the two ports in recent years and may be called a modern record.

The steam schooner Northland has been chartered to load lumber on the Columbia for San Pedro at \$6 per thousand and from present indications this rate will be the accepted one for steam tonnage for some time to come. The barkentine Newsboy, now in the river to load lumber for San Pedro, has a rate of \$5.50, but this charter was made at an earlier date.

LABORER CALMLY SEES DOCTORS CUT OFF HAND
SPOKANE, Wash., Aug. 1.—After having his hand nearly severed by an edger saw in the Phoenix lumber mill, Frank Henley, a laborer, walked nine blocks to the Spokane general hospital and calmly asked for treatment. The hand was amputated without the patient taking an anesthetic, he insisting on watching the operation. After the member was removed Henley took the streetcar to his home at the northern city limits, saying he would figure out some way of making a living with one hand.
