

#### SEEK CANCER CURE

Successful Experiments Being Made Near Berlin. (By Associated Press to the Coos Bay

Times). BERLIN, Germany, Aug.

new treatment for cancer, which the experimenters are careful to describe as yet as a "treatment" and not as a cure," is being tried in Professor Czerny's Samaritan Hospital at Held. elberg with results even more favorable than were anticipated.

The treatment is based on a di covery made in investigating the effects of Rontgen and radium rays upon cancer. It was found that these rays transformed lecithin, a phosphorized fat found in the tissues of the body, into cholin, a substance known to chemistry, and it was conjectured that it was this cholin
