# TERMINAL CO. IS ENJOINED

### Restrained From Crossing a Certain Strip of Land in North Marshfield.

An Injunction was served on the Terminal Railway yesterday afternoon restraining the company from extending its line through certain property in the north part of the city. The injunction was granted by Judge John S. Coke and the arguments on the injunction will be heard in his court. The injunction was asked for by C. E. Nicholson of the Coos Bay Ice and Cold Storage company.

It is alleged that the company was to extend the road through property held by the cold storage company. This property has been involved in legal proceedings before and includes what is marked on the plat as Delta street. The same property was involved in the suit of Seabrook against the Coos Bay Ice and Cold Storage company. The question of the title of the property is said to be due to the differences of the surveys in that locality. The injunction simply restrains the terminal from building over that particular property and does not affect any of the rest of the work.

Arguments by both sides on the injunction will be heard by Judge Coke.

### Councilman Ferguson Thinks Plan for Opening Eleventh Street Important.
