You, as a consumer, when refusing to do so become a poor "booster" for Coos county and likewise utterly ties from Myrtle Point. fail to take into account a necessary

feature to your own welfare. All fruit dealers and consumers are hereby requested to read carefully these simple instructions and make known to all fruit growers how

Dear Sir:

Replying to your favor of 12th inst. will say that fruit treated in such manner as to destroy infection tions for treatment of infected fruit be substantially followed. In treating fruit only such treatment as is authorized by the State Board of Horticulture should be applied to-wit: immersion in a one per cent (Baume) lime-sulphur solution for a sufficient time to destroy all infection. Four minutes' immersion is required in such cases, and in all cases conspicous marking of package is also required. Concentrated lye is a remedy not recognized by the State Board and consequently not permissible. This service cannot assume to suggest selling prices, but the buying public must be plainly advised of the nature of the fruit in the package, and the marking must be done prior to shipment from the place where grown. If the above regulations are carried out, you will be unmolested by this office. 
