He said that the tunnel on this end was the only work that might delay, it being uncertain as to what they would strike in the blg bore. until they get ready to use it, he said. Mr. Hoey made a trip down over the Oregon Central and says that there is considerable heavy work to be done on that project. It is rather waiting on the Natron extension now. The road has been completed forty miles north from Klamath Falls.
