SIZE OF WARSHIP.

Pennsylvania Will Be as Large as England's New One. (By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.)

WASHINGTON, Sept. 9.—The new battleship Pennsylvania, authorized by congress at the last session will be fully as large as the great battleship the British government just ordered, according to the plans of the naval general board. Her displacement exceeds thirty thousands tons. She will burn oil fuel. Her general dimensions are 630 feet long, 102 foot beam and 26 to 28 foot draught.

REFORM WAVE HITS DENVER

Many Prominent Officials and Business Men Indicted in Vice Crusade.

(By Associated Press to The Coos Bay Times.)

DENVER, Sept. 11.—More than a score of present and former city officials and prominent business men of Denver appeared today in the criminal division of the district court either in person or by an attorney and gave bonds to appear to answer to charges contained in the grand jury indictments. In each case the bond was fixed at one thousand dollars, and in the cases of the present city officials they were released on their own recognizance.

The hearing will be October 5. The charges are that the present and former city officials failed to enforce laws against open vice. Among those appearing were present Mayor Henry J. Arnold, former Mayor R. W. Speer, present Chief of Police Felix O'Neil, and former Chief Armstrong. Several owners of property used for immoral purposes were among those arrested.
