

CANCEL NOTED ALASKA FRAUD

All of the Cunningham Entries
Annulled by Sec. Fisher—
Echo of Ballinger Case.

(By Associated Press to the Coos Bay Times.)
WASHINGTON, Sept. 13.—All of the 33 so-called Cunningham Alaska coal land claims involving alleged fraudulent blanket patents which contributed to the Ballinger-Pinchot controversy have been disposed of finally by the Interior department. The appeals were adversely decided and the entries were ordered cancelled.

BANKERS TALK FARMING.

Men of Finance Discuss Agriculture Development.

DETROIT, Sept. 13.—The problem of agricultural development as viewed by men of finance promised almost to eclipse the currency question at the closing sessions today of the American Bankers' association. With the exception of some routine work and the formal election of officers, the convention planned to devote practically all its time to the discussion of plans for the assistance of the American farmers. The currency commission will have no report to the convention today, according to the general understanding. The delegates appeared perfectly willing to let the question rest for a time.

GIBSON WILL DEFEND SELF

New York Lawyer Accused of
Killing Client Plans His
Own Defense.

MIDDLETON, N. Y., Sept. 13.—The fight which Burton W. Gibson, the New York lawyer, will make for his life, he said today, will be directed entirely by himself. He intends to appear on his own behalf when arraigned September 24, before County Judge Royce, on the charge of murdering Mrs. Rosa Menschik Szabo, his Viennese client, who met death while boating with him, July 16.

SPEAKS IN IDAHO.

Roosevelt Advocates Limiting Expenditures in Campaigns.

POCATELLO, Idaho, Sept. 13.—Colonel Roosevelt made two speeches today in Southern Idaho. He spoke at Blackfoot today under auspicious circumstances. Speaking of campaign contributions, he said: "I believe the time is coming when the government must limit the amount of money to spent upon political campaigns. One way in which this could be done is by using school houses for political meetings for all, regardless of party." Colonel Roosevelt said he had advocated the use of the school houses two years ago, and that he had not "stolen Wilson's thunder" in again urging their use for political purposes.

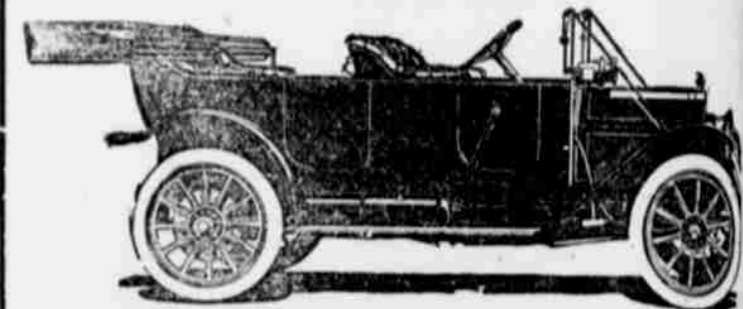
