

## JUDGE COKE FAVORS PLAN

Gives His Opinion Regarding Making of Boulevard to the Sea.

The opinion expressed by Judge Coke last night at the city council meeting relative to the boulevard plan is of especial interest. Judge Coke said:

"In regard to the matter of a boulevard to the sea which is before you, I wish to state that I am most heartily in favor of this project. If there is one thing that this community and this county needs it is the improvement of its highways. Nature has done a great deal for us, but it is our duty to make the most of our natural advantages. It is a difficult matter at the present time for visitors to come to Coos Bay, and we ought to make the place and its surroundings just as attractive and accessible as we can.

"A million dollars spent for good roads in Coos county would give us roads of permanence, that sum would at least macadamize all our roads. The interest on a million dollar bonds would be \$50,000 and would insure good roads now and in the future. As it is we spend \$200,000 for taxes and have no roads worth mentioning for this vast expenditure.

"The road to the beach would be a profitable investment. Such a road would direct the travel to our beaches through Marshfield rather than by some other route. Just for example I will tell you what I saw at Yaquina Bay. Yaquina Bay is just a little narrow gulch, about the size of one of the gulches leading out of South Slough. And yet the day I was there I learned that there were 7000 summer visitors there. Figuring conservatively that each of these 7000 people spend \$3.00 per day, we see a revenue of \$21,000 per day or over \$600,000 a month or between a million and half and two million dollars in a season from these summer visitors at little Yaquina. I consider that this money is just as desirable as the money from our dairies, indeed it is more active money coming into more people's hands.

"Our beaches, from Coos Head to below Shore Acres are one hundred per cent more attractive than anything they have at Yaquina Bay, and with proper communication with the outside and between Marshfield and our beaches, the revenue from the summer tourists will come to this city.

"If we wait perhaps a good road from Bandon or by some other route will be built by more enterprising people and Marshfield will lose this

"You may figure that a direct road to the sea such as the one proposed will eventually be opened regardless of our action on the proposal made by the Reynolds Development company. But that might take years, for there are several owners to reckon with and not all of them contemplate platting. Therefore I urge that advantage be taken of the opportunity now offered and this improvement be commenced. Such a road will be a profitable investment as well as a pleasure, affording an opportunity to visit the beach not only in summer but during the winter months. I am for the Marshfield-to-the-sea boulevard."

## WOULD MOVE STREET LINE

Terminal Company Suggests Change in Front Street to Abolish Angle.

At the meeting of the city council last night the Terminal Company made a proposition to the city regarding a change in the lines of Front street. The matter was brought up by W. S. Chandler. At the cold storage plant Front street makes a sharp angle. At this angle the Terminal company has purchased two lots in order that the tracks of the road can make a convenient curve, instead of an angle. The proposition made by the company was to have the city change Front street so that there would be a curve to conform with the right of way of the road. The single track of the Terminal road on Front street is a little east of the center of the street. If the street is made to curve as proposed by the Terminal folks the tracks would on this curve extend along the west side of the street. It was suggested by some of the councilmen that this might look peculiar and the idea was brought up that it might be well for the city to purchase a part of the two lots north of the two that are owned by the Terminal Co. This would permit of making a less acute curve than is suggested by the Terminal so that the track could on the curve take the same position as on the rest of the street. It was suggested that as the old street would be given up on the waterfront side of the present angle perhaps the property owners on that side might pay enough for the additional land to meet the expense of the parts of the two lots which it would be necessary for the city to buy.

The matter was all referred to the street committee, the city engineer and the Terminal Co. Some decision will be reached before next Friday, when another meeting of the council is to be held. The street improvement work is held up until the matter is decided, consequently the haste.

The council allowed Moon and Barkley \$190 and Hugh McLain \$291 on account for street work on Fourth street.

The council granted an extension of 30 days to Contractor Dowling in which to finish his street work. This was done on account of the inability of the contractor to secure stone.

presented to the council an agreement regarding the giving of a strip of land for the boulevard from Marshfield to the sea. The agreement contains the details as have been discussed by the council a number of times. Judge Coke and City Attorney Goss both spoke on the matter, suggesting that there were some details of the agreement which should be changed. Judge Coke favored the boulevard plan.

The agreement states that the company shall have the right to lay water mains when it sees fit. It was suggested that there perhaps should be some restrictions to this so that the street could not be constantly torn up for the purpose of laying mains. The agreement also states that the company shall have the right to lay out streets intersecting the boulevard wherever desired. It was also suggested that there should be restrictions in this clause so that there would be some regularity to the streets. These and some other details were discussed. There was no definite action taken on the agreement excepting that the city engineer was instructed to make a survey to see if the route as proposed by the Reynolds Development Co. was practical for the building of a roadway.

**Other Business.**  
Warrants were ordered drawn for the collection of the assessment on Fourth street from Central to Donnelly. It was ordered by the council that the ballot boxes be cleared of the old ballots preparatory to the special election to be held next Monday.

Congressman Copple and Merchant were appointed for the meeting of the finance committee to fill vacancies in order that bills might be allowed.

City Attorney Goss was instructed to appeal to the supreme court the case of the Bennett Trust Co. against the city regarding a strip of land on Second street. The city attorney was also instructed to take steps to protect the city in the damage suit which has been started by the heirs of George Parker who was killed while riding his motorcycle on Broadway.
