

## FOOTE CASE IS DISCUSSED

Attorney Says No Blame Was Laid Against the Prosecutors.

The Oregonian published this morning contains an article regarding the pardon of W. R. Foote. It is given to understand in the article that the prosecuting attorney's office did not do its duty in the prosecution of Wilcox for his offense previous to the killing of him by Foote.

R. O. Graves, who was one of the attorneys for Foote, in speaking of the matter, says that no such claim was ever made by Foote or for him. The defendant and his attorneys laid no blame against the prosecuting attorney's office. Mr. Graves states that Foote did not know of the attempted offense against the third daughter until after he had been at the state's attorney's office and about 20 minutes before the shooting took place. Mr. Graves says that there was nothing brought out to show that there was any blame against the prosecuting attorney or his office.
