## D. C. GREEN IS ELECTED

**Chosen President of Chamber of Commerce to Succeed Dr. McCormac.**

D. C. Green, local manager for the Oregon Power company, was last night elected president of the Marshfield Chamber of Commerce to succeed Dr. J. T. McCormac who has resigned because he will leave soon for California where he expects to reside during part of each year.

The meeting was called to order by Dr. McCormac who announced that he was retiring and that the most important business to be transacted at the meeting was the election of a president.

Henry Sengstacken placed Mr. Green in nomination and he was unanimously elected. Attorney C. R. Peck moved that the Chamber of Commerce extend to Dr. McCormac a vote of thanks for his long, efficient and faithful work at the head of the Chamber of Commerce and for the hard work and financial support he had given Coos Bay. The motion carried. Dr. McCormac expressed his appreciation of the vote of thanks and said he would always be with Coos Bay in all her efforts and give the locality all the support he could. He spoke in the highest terms of Mr. Green, his successor as president, referring to him as a young man highly efficient and suited to the office of president of the Chamber of Commerce.

Mr. Green also spoke accepting the office. The new president has been in Marshfield for about eight months as manager of the Oregon Power company here. He has taken a deep interest in public affairs and has been active in the work of the Chamber of Commerce. Mr. Green's position has caused him to meet the business men of the Bay and although he has not been here long he has an extensive acquaintance.
