

# LIVED HERE FORTY YEARS

### Charles Westman Who Died Yesterday Is an Old Pioneer.

Charles Westman, one of the pioneers of Coos Bay, died yesterday afternoon at his home in the north part of the city. A complication of diseases caused death. The funeral will be held from the Wilson undertaking parlors tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock. Rev. John E. Ostlund will officiate.

Mr. Westman was 68 years of age. He was a native of Sweden and came to Coos Bay forty years ago. He took up a homestead on Haynes Inlet, but for the past ten years had resided in Marshfield. He leaves a wife from whom he was divorced and four sons and one daughter in California.

# GOOD ROADS THE PURPOSE

### Mayor Morrison of Coquille Suggests Forming County Organization to Boost.

Mayor A. T. Morrison of Coquille was in the city today to confer regarding the plan of building a permanent highway to Roseburg. Mr. Morrison met Mayor Straw, D. C. Green, president of the Chamber of Commerce and others of this city, and also went to North Bend where he met Dr. Bartle, president of the Chamber of Commerce, and others of that city. Mr. Morrison was simply here on a preliminary trip with a view to learning the feeling of the commercial bodies and officials with a view to holding a meeting some time soon to form some kind of an organization which can take up the road matter. In speaking of the plan Mr. Morrison said:

"My idea is to try and get all of the cities in the county together. All of those with whom I have talked are highly in favor of the plan and they all say that we should hold a meeting some time soon. There appears to be no reason why the matter should be put off. After going to Myrtle Point and Bandon some time this week we will decide upon a date. I think the only way that the road matter can be handled is to form an organization and then if the new road laws pass, as they doubtless will, we can make arrangements to bond the county for road building purposes. The organization can make it a business to educate the voters on the importance of a good road. All of those with whom I have talked agree that a bonding proposition is the only way we can do very much in the way of road building.

"Everyone favors the plan and it seems that it only needs some organization to start it along. We will then be in shape to take the matter up in a business-like way."
