MURDERER CONFESSES.

Man in Detroit Tells of Killing a Young Girl.

DETROIT, Mich., Oct. 4.—George Brown Spindler, a laborer 30 years old, who was arrested in connection with the murder of 12-year-old Matilda Reis, whose mutilated body was found near her home last Tuesday, has confessed to murder of Helen Brown, 11 years old, whose body was found in a coal yard, December 12, 1909. He also admitted two assaults on young girls within the last 13 months. The police are investigating.
