#### HISTORY OF GAME.

First World's Championship Was Played in 1884.

The first baseball game recorded as played for "the championship of the world was in 1884, when Providence of the National League, defeated the Metropolitans of New York, 3 to 0. In the 27 years since then there have been 18 other world series staged, the last eight of which, since 1903, have been under auspices of the National Baseball commission.

The Boston Americans won this first series under the commission auspices, from Pittsburg. In 1904 the following year, the Giants and Red Sox were, as now, the pennant winning clubs in the two leagues, but no world series was played. Thereafter, however, the games have been arranged annually, and in the eight series there have been 48 games played of which the National league clubs have won 24, and one was tied.
