The seating capacity at the Polo grounds in New York is 38,000. The seating capacity at Fenway park in Boston is 30,000. Admission to the games ranges from 50 cents for bleacher tickets to \$25 for the boxes.

HISTORY OF GAME.
First World's Championship Was Played in 1884.
The first baseball game recorded as played for "the championship of the world" was in 1884, when Providence of the National League, defeated the Metropolitans of New York, 3 to 0. In the 27 years since then there have been 18 other world series staged, the last eight of which, since 1903, have been under auspices of the National Baseball commission.
The Boston Americans won this first series under the commission auspices, from Pittsburgh. In 1901 the following year, the Giants and Red Sox were, as now, the pennant winning clubs in the two leagues, but no world series was played. Thereafter, however, the games have been arranged annually, and in the eight series there have been 43 games played of which the National league clubs have won 24, and one was tied.

HAVE FOUR UMPIRES.
Are Chosen by President of the Two Major Leagues.
(By Associated Press to The Coos Bay Times.)
NEW YORK, Oct. 8.—Arbitration of the close plays in world championship games is vested in a force of four umpires, or twice the number in ordinary games. One is stationed behind the plate, one about the bases and two in the outfield.
The selection of the umpires is made by the presidents of the two major leagues, each choosing two from his staff. The choice this year fell upon:
William Klem and Charles Riggler, representing the National league.
William Evans and "Silk" O'Laughlin, representing the American league.
Klem is the only one of the four who participated in last year's series, although all of them are veterans as big league umpires and are generally popular with the baseball public.

FIRE THEIR TREASURER

Progressive Party Club Is Already in Trouble With an Officer.

The following resolutions are explanatory:
WHEREAS the Marshfield Progressive Club is an organization formed and fostered for the express purpose of advancing the interests and success of the Progressive Party as the agency through which, alone, the principles adopted by the first national convention of that party can, in any considerable measure, be carried out in the interests of the whole people of this country; and
WHEREAS, it is wholly inconsistent with the purposes for which this club was formed and is fostered that avowed members of an opposing political party should be actively affiliated therewith and should hold office in said club; and
WHEREAS, the person who has been honored with the office of treasurer of this said organization has renounced allegiance to the said Progressive party and has gone forth after sitting in the councils of the said Progressive party and has succeeded after devious maneuverings in obtaining for himself a seat in the councils of the Republican party in this (Coos) county;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the office of treasurer of this organization be, by the president thereof, declared vacant; and
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the sense of this meeting that neither the Progressive party as a political party, nor this club as a local branch of said political party has been in any wise weakened or its efficiency impaired by the final determination of the real political status of the individual above referred to; but that, on the contrary, the interests of both, and particularly the standing of this club in the community, have been advanced and strengthened by the apparent, or seeming acquisition of the Republican party; and
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the cheerful satisfaction of this club upon learning of the real political complexion of its erstwhile treasurer be published and declared by directing the secretary to cause a copy of this resolution to be printed in one or more of the newspapers of the City of Marshfield, and by mailing a "marked copy" of a newspaper containing the same to the chairman of the Republican Central Committee of Coos County.
