**AMERICAN NAVY.**

**B**OTH as a number of vessels and weight of guns the Atlantic fleet which mobilizes in New York harbor October 12-15, will surpass the German fleet which Emperor William recently reviewed off Heligoland in the North Sea. Of the 122 American ships to be mobilized next month, 34 are battleships, as against the 22 German battleships assembled in the German review. The American fleet will be armed with eight 13-inch guns, four each on the Indiana and Massachusetts, while the German ships have no guns of that bore, and only 48 12-inch guns, as against 148 12-inch guns on the American vessels. Secondary guns of calibre below 11 inches found by scores on the German armada will be numbered by hundreds on the American fleet. The American ships will have on board about 1000 commissioned officers, 300 warrant officers and 27,000 enlisted men.

**J. O. STEMMLER ANNOUNCES HIS PLATFORM**

I believe in direct presidential primaries.  
I believe in the direct vote for United States senators, and until this can be obtained, in Statement No. 1.  
If elected I will live up to and enforce all laws, including the Oregon System.  
I believe in a revision of the judicial system with a view of simplifying, expediting and cheapening justice.  
I believe in and will work for state aid for permanent county roads scientifically built under sound business management.  
I will work for such legislation as will open Rogue river to commercial fishing to residents of Curry county.  
If elected I will work for the establishment of an experimental agricultural station for Coos and Curry counties, having been one of the first citizens in Coos county to advocate such a move.

I believe and will work for the adoption of an Industrial Compensation Act, whereby each industry will promptly and automatically compensate all persons injured by its operations, without recourse to the Courts.  
I believe in legislation relieving the sheriff's office of the collection of taxes, placing it in the hands of a special officer, also a uniform system of collecting, auditing and handling same in every county throughout the state.  
I believe in a reasonable exemption of household and personal effects from taxation, to a valuation of \$500.00.  
If elected, I will work for the abolishment of the office of County School Supervisor, as I consider it a useless expenditure of public money.  
If elected, I will use my best efforts for the passage of the so-called Blue Sky Law, prohibiting the operation of fake corporations in this state.  
If elected, I will refuse to represent any faction and will always aid any resident of the district in any meritorious legislation.
