NEW YORK, Oct. 25.—Collier's Weekly, which has heretofore supported Woodrow Wilson for the presidency, has declared for Roosevelt and Johnson and will hereafter vigorously support the Progressive cause.

Norman Hapgood is no longer the editor. His resignation was handed to Robert J. Collier on Wednesday, to take effect the following day. Collier's henceforth will become a Progressive paper and will support Colonel Roosevelt instead of Governor Wilson, as formerly. The change of political faith, however, is not the cause of Hapgood's resignation, according to the former editor. Hapgood said tonight that he was not inclined to give the reason for his resignation unless Collier made public some definite reason. Messages passed between Collier and Hapgood's home, which is almost diagonally across Park avenue from Collier's, and at 10:30 o'clock Collier gave out this statement:

"Much of the quality for which Collier's has received praise has been due to Norman Hapgood's rare and high quality in American journalism of saying true things effectively. Collier's loses, and if honest journalism counts in America, the country loses by Norman Hapgood's leaving Collier's."

In handing out this statement Collier amplified it orally, saying: "I would rather be hurt myself than to hurt him, but unfortunately we differ on a question of politics." He was asked if that meant that he would swing Collier's to Colonel Roosevelt, he replied: "Yes, you bet it does."

"Then you will become editor of Collier's?"  
"Yes; God help me, I guess I'll have to go to work."

## BOY SCOUTS "SWAT" FLIES.

La Grande Campaign Results in Vast Slaughter of Pests.

LA GRANDE, Or., Oct. 21.—Last Thursday marked the closing of the Boy Scouts "swat the fly" campaign and it is estimated that there were killed over 12,000,000 flies. Joseph Reynolds captured the first prize of \$5, killing over 5,000,000 flies. ## HER DISHWASHING A JOY.

Vassar Girl Presses a Button and Machinery Does the Work.

BOSTON, Oct. 22.—Wiping dishes or carrying them has gone out of the life of Mrs. Georgia Boynton Child, who lives at "the little house in the woods," Darien, Conn., as she has evolved a scheme that practically makes washing dishes a pleasure.

She points to this as an evidence that a college education does not unfit a woman for housework. She is a Vassar graduate and is classed as a housekeeping expert. Her husband, Alfred T. Child, helps in the household work.

Mrs. Child has made a rack with a place to hold each dish inverted. By a scientific process she gets the dishes scraped and washed in the quickest time possible. Then after being drenched with scalding water, they are hung on the rack. In five minutes they dry themselves. The rack is attached to a wheeled mechanical contrivance.

Pressing a button carries the dried dishes to the china closet. Another mechanical "waitress" carries soiled dishes to the kitchen.

# J. O. STEMMLER ANNOUNCES HIS PLATFORM

I believe in direct presidential primaries.

I believe in the direct vote for United States senators, and until this can be obtained, in Statement No. 1.

I believe in legislation relieving the sheriff's office of the collection of taxes, placing it in the hands of a special officer, also a uniform system of collecting, auditing and handling same in every county throughout the state.

I believe in a reasonable exemption of household and personal effects from taxation, to a valuation of \$500.00.

If elected, I will work for the abolishment of the office of County School Supervisor, as I consider it a useless expenditure of public money.

If elected, I will use my best efforts for the passage of the so-called Blue Sky Law, prohibiting the operation of fake corporations in this state.

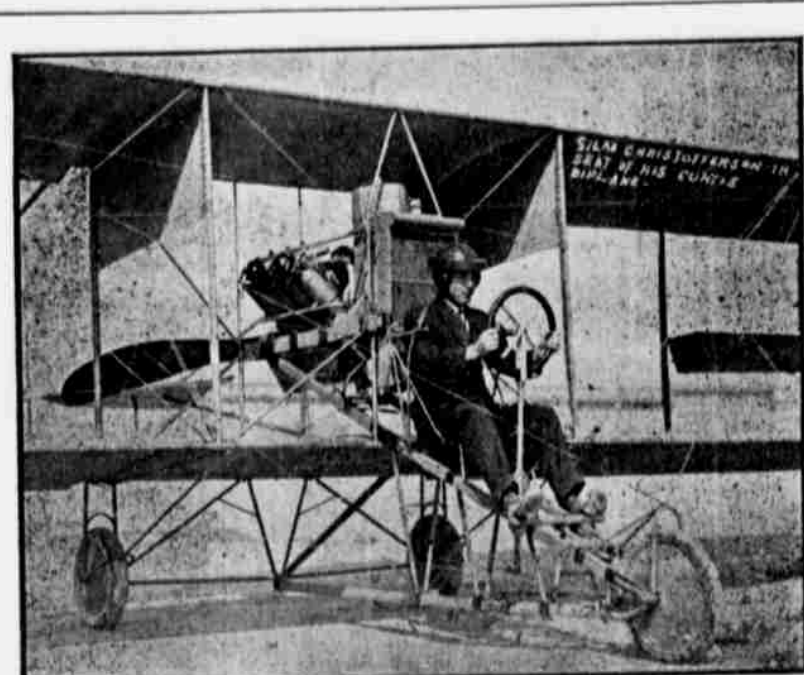
If elected, I will refuse to represent any faction and will always aid any resident of the district in any meritorious legislation.
