GRADUATED TAX IS SINGLE TAX

FELS FUND PUTS UP CASH FOR SOLE PURPOSE.

Great Battle Ground in Oregon is Seeing Fight Now at Most Crucial Point—Shields Advises on Vote.

Who is supporting the Graduated Single Tax?

Who is paying the hired workers and boosters for the Graduated Single Tax?

The Fels Fund Commission of America.

Why are they doing it?

And are you aware of the fact that the Fels Fund Commission was formed in 1909 for the express purpose of establishing the Henry George doctrine of Single Tax in America within five years from that date?

How does it happen the Commission is spending its money in Oregon?

Oregon was selected as the state where the Commission was to make the attempt of establishing its doctrine and it is in Oregon that the great tax battle is now being waged.

The Graduated Single Tax amendment to the state constitution is the measure the Commission through its hired workers is centering all of its forces and energies upon. You hear them say very little or nothing about the Single Tax county measure. They are spending vast sums to secure the adoption of the Graduated Single Tax.

Do you think this Commission which was organized for the specific purpose above named would spend such sums of money for the adoption of this Graduated Single Tax measure if it were not in keeping with the designs and the purpose for which it was organized?

Most assuredly not. Why should the Graduated Single Tax measure exempt all forms of wealth except land if it was not designed to establish the Single Tax or the land value tax as enunciated by Henry George? There can be no other reason given for exempting all other forms of wealth except land value other than that of establishing the Single Tax.

Business men, home-owners, farmers, merchants, mechanics, laborers and professional men, be not deceived? The Graduated Single Tax exemption amendment means Single Tax, or the Commission would not be willing to spend \$100,000 in the State of Oregon to secure its adoption.

Single Tax means the destruction of private property in land. That is the fundamental principle of the doctrine—that, and that alone, is the reason for exempting all forms of wealth except land. Single Tax means that the selling value of your home, your lot, or your farm will entirely disappear.

Single Tax means that the land is to be held in common that the state is to collect the rent as a landlord now collects it. Single Tax means foreclosure of mortgages. It means that new loans cannot be secured. It means the entire disappearance of the selling value you now hold in your land, your home, or your lot. Single Tax means the overturning of the present fiscal system and a great and lasting financial depression. The Single Tax will ruin the State of Oregon. Single Tax, as is contemplated in this Graduated Single Tax measure, is not to be found anywhere in the world.

Why should Oregon sacrifice her prosperity, her good name, her future opportunities, her home, to satisfy the theories of Joseph Fels, his Commission, and other visionaries?

The people of Oregon are capable of handling their own law-making. They should let the world know that they are not going to adopt every fool measure that is offered from abroad.

To kill this attempted pernicious legislation, vote against the Graduated Single Tax 365 X NO. Vote to repeal the tricky U'Ren Single Tax Home Rule adopted in 1910, and to do this vote 308 X YES.

Let the world know that the people of Oregon are safe, sane and level headed!

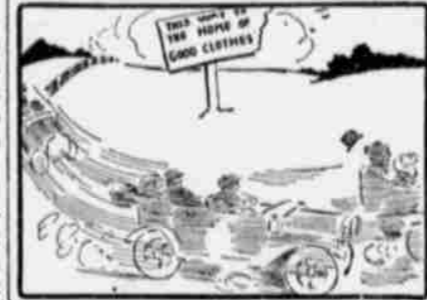

STUDENTS TO SELL TICKETS

Plan to Get Crowd Out Friday For High School Football Game.

The Coquille and Marshfield High School football teams have each defeated Myrtle Point, so the game between them here Friday will probably be a decisive one, the winning team being in a place to claim the county championship.

Coquille has mostly new men, but has very promising material and is well coached. They are using the new style football very effectively.

Marshfield has some old players and some who are playing for the first time in high school games. The two teams are well balanced.

The game with Myrtle Point last Saturday shows that Marshfield will have to fight and to win as the comparative scores of the two games with Myrtle Point gives Coquille an advantage.

The Coquille-Myrtle Point score was 13 to 0, while the Marshfield-Myrtle Point score was 18 to 12.

Instead of selling tickets the students will sell tags, as the grounds are not enclosed, and it is hoped that the sale will be large, as the team has been put to heavy expense in making the trip to Myrtle Point and buying new material for the players. The tags should be worn to the game, so that the purchaser will not have the misfortune of having to purchase a second one after reaching the grounds.

The business houses of town will not be asked to close, as the management realize that business comes before pleasure. If any of the business houses desire to help the team in this or in any other way, such help will be gratefully received by the management.

The game will be called at 2:30 p. m. Friday at the depot grounds.

ORCHARD COVERS CROPS.

Good Protection to Soil Through the Winter.

CORVALLIS, Ore., Oct. 30.—The importance of the growing of cover crops in orchards is emphasized in a recent bulletin on orchard irrigation issued by the Oregon Agricultural College.

"Cover crops add humus and fibre to the soil," says the bulletin. "The fibre adds to the moisture-holding capacity of the light soils and makes the heavier types more friable, and more easily handled. Any soil of high clay or silt content and low in organic matter is not only difficult to handle with respect to cultivation, but also as to irrigation."

"This type of soil takes up water very slowly. Percolation is so slow that a large number of furrows are necessary if a sufficient amount of water is to be supplied. Thus a greater surface for evaporation is exposed, and such soils bake and crack badly on drying out. A good cover crop, either natural or sown, if plowed under early in the spring, will aid greatly in overcoming these difficulties."

In experiments it was noticed that when there had been a late irrigation a good natural cover crop grew up, of chickweed, alfalfa and various grasses. In one orchard cover crops of vetch and rye sown of barley, sown early in September after late irrigations, started readily and made fine growth.

An early cover crop of this nature not only adds its own fibre to the soil, but prevents the leaves from blowing away, thus keeping them where they will be of benefit. Those cover crops which get a good start early in the fall make the best kind of protection for the soil during the winter.

AMERICAN HORSES WIN.
LONDON, Oct. 30.—American-bred horses have won more events this year than ever before on the English turf. Among them the offspring of James R. Keane's once famous sprinter Voter figure the most frequently, two of his sons, Election and Selectman, having upset theorists on breeding by winning long distance races.

Golden Rod and Coney Island, two English-bred grandsons of J. B. Haggin's Emperor of Norfolk, also proved themselves good winners this season.

August Belmont's Tracery has won \$48,000 and H. B. Duryea's Sweeper II, \$30,000 during the year. Duryea has also won as much more in France with Shannon, an American, bred colt sired by the brilliant race horse Irish Lad out of Census by Ethelbert.
