WEATHER MAN INSPECTOR HERE

Forecaster From Portland Looks Over Service in This Locality.

Theodore F. Drake, local weather forecaster at Portland, is in the city to inspect the weather signals of the locality. Mr. Drake came in on the Drain stage last night and will be in the city for several days. He will test the service here and see that it is being properly conducted and will go overland on the Coos Bay wagon road to Reston where there is a signal station.

Mr. Drake was on the stage with a number of other passengers who found the body of one of the men who was drowned in the Osprey wreck.

Mr. Drake left this morning for the lower bay where he will inspect the signals of the life saving station.

DEER LIMIT MAY BE TWO

Game Warden Thinks Five, as at Present, Is Too Many.

The deer season which closed October 31, may be the last in which each hunter will be allowed to kill five deer. State Game Warden W. L. Finley is working for a reduction of the limit from five to two or three, probably two and a measure to that effect will be introduced at the next session of the Legislature.

Oregon is the most liberal state in the Union at present, and although deer are still plentiful, the fact that their extermination is being approached by steam and electric railroads makes a reduction of the limit necessary for the perpetuation of the species, according to Mr. Finley.

California and Washington states which have as much deer ground as Oregon, allow the hunter to get but two deer in any season, while Montana permits three.

This measure may find considerable opposition from some hunters, but Mr. Finley is confident that the majority will be glad to see a reduction of the number allowed.

Friday.

LOOKS INTO EXPRESS RATE

Railway Commission in California Takes Up Wells-Fargo Charges.

(By Associated Press to The Coos Bay Times.)

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 7.—Testimony in the state railroad commission investigation of express rates showed the Wells-Fargo Co. had on investment in California \$1,116,167 received in two average months June and July, 1911, a gross revenue of \$1,453,345, which would amount to \$8,720,000 in 12 months, or practically 800 per cent on the capital outstanding. It was shown that the rates in California are 200 to 400 per cent higher than corresponding distances in the states where the state commissions have fixed rates. Some shippers pay disproportionate charges.
