SAYS WILSON WILL FAIL

TERRE HAUTE, Ind., Nov. 19.—Eugene V. Debs, socialist candidate for president, issued the following reviling the result:

"The outcome of the election is, fortunately, so decisive as to place the democrats in complete control of the government. After March 4 there can be no dodging of responsibility.

"That the democratic administration will be a flat failure goes without saying. If radical tariff revision or legislation in the interest of the working class is attempted the big interests will be heard from in a way to make the democratic statesmen hesitate. THE FIR TREE ROOT LOUSE

CORVALLIS, Nov. 19.—A new menace to one of Oregon's biggest industries, the timber trade, is found in the fir tree root louse, recently discovered by the entomology experts of the Oregon Agricultural College. It is called *Phloeobius Bumelia*, and often stunts the young trees.

"This louse spends the winter in two different stages, eggs found on the bark of ash trees, and hibernating lice on the fir tree roots," said Prof. H. F. Wilson, discussing the new pest. "Those on the fir continue to live on the roots, while those on the bark of the ash trees hatch in spring from the eggs and crawl to the leaves where they feed, causing the leaves to curl. In the latter part of May and June winged forms appear and migrate from the leaves to the fir roots, where they produce wingless lice, which remain there until late in the fall. These last then produce a generation which includes both winged and wingless forms. The wingless remain on the fir roots through the winter, while the winged ones migrate back to the ash and deposit their eggs on the bark. These remain there all winter.

"The serious thing about the pest is that the lice attack the young fir trees when they are from 1 to 4 years old, and in many cases the trees become stunted from the injuries caused by the feeding of the lice."

DIAMONDS ARE LOST IN BATH

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 19.—Max Levy, a New York diamond salesman, told friends here today that gems of his, valued at \$22,500, had been lost through a drain in a bath tub yesterday. Levy valued the diamonds so greatly that he would not trust them even to the safe in the hotel where he was a guest. He carried them in a small chamois bag about his neck, even when bathing. This he was doing when the string supporting the bag broke and the diamonds disappeared through the drain.

Levy dashed down four flights of stairs and told his troubles to the hotel clerk. An engineer recovered the diamonds for Levy, who presented him with a diamond pin.

MAYOR ASKED TO RESIGN

Governor West Takes Action Against Chief Executive of Roseburg.

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 19.—Governor West issued an ultimatum to Mayor Micelli, of Roseburg. Micelli must resign and make way for some one who will enforce the liquor laws, or the governor will see that the suits to put the Roseburg Brewery and Ice company, of which Mayor Micelli is one of the leading stockholders, out of business are vigorously prosecuted.

"Unless Mayor Micelli resigns I have instructed District Attorney Brown to bring an injunction suit against the Roseburg Brewery and Ice Company and also to proceed to revoke the company's charter," declared the governor. "If Mayor Micelli gets out of office and lets some one in who will enforce the laws, there may not be need to prosecute these civil suits."

For some time District Attorney Brown has had the officials of the brewery company in court on a charge of violating the local option law. The brewery was supposed to be manufacturing nothing but near-beer, but the charge was made that real beer was being manufactured and sold there. The jury which tried the first case hung six to six. Then in the election the brewery people made a vigorous fight against the reelection of District Attorney Brown who made a campaign issue out of his determination to fight the brewery to a finish. After Brown's reelection five directors of the brewery company went into court and pleaded guilty to violating the local option law and paid fines aggregating over \$2,000.

"As the mayor is a leading stockholder of this company he should now get out of the office," said the governor, "and if he doesn't he will have to take the consequences. The confession of guilt of the directors will be good material for having the company's license revoked."
