**LEAVES TODAY FOR PORTLAND**

**E. S. J. McAllister, Attorney Wanted in Portland, Leaves Today.**

E. S. J. McAllister, the Portland lawyer, who was here taking depositions in the case of Herrmann vs. Hall, Sengstacken, Smith, et al, left this morning to face the charges of sodomy which he was informed yesterday had been preferred against him. He made no further statement than to strenuously declare that he was the victim of false charges.

According to telegrams from Portland, it was expected there that he would be placed under arrest here. However, Marshal Carter did not receive any instructions to arrest him.

Portland papers announce that 59 arrests have been made in the case, which is one of the most revolting scandals that has been stirred up there in a long time.

Mr. Schwartz, a young attorney and stenographer who was here with McAllister, remained over to complete the taking of depositions in the case today. He will leave tonight.

It was understood that Mr. McAllister left via Drain and it was reported on the streets that en route out a Portland officer met him and took him into custody but this could not be confirmed.
